I Lay Dying, Light in August, and Absalom, Absalom! He also shows that, while Faulkner's ancestors were no ordinary people, and while he

sometimes flashed a curious pride in them, Faulkner came to embrace a pervasive sense of shame concerning both his family and his culture. This he wove into his writing, especially about sex, race, class, and violence, psychic and otherwise.
