John Dewey's Ethical Theory - Roberto Frega

This book provides a wide-ranging, systematic, and comprehensive approach to the moral philosophy of John Dewey, one of the most important philosophers of the 20th century. It does so by focusing on his greatest achievement in this field: the *Ethics* he jointly published with James Hayden Tufts in 1908 and then republished in a heavily revised version in 1932. The essays in this volume are divided into two distinct parts. The first features essays that provide a running commentary on the chapters of the 1932 *Ethics* written by Dewey. Each chapter is introduced, situated within a historical perspective, and then its main achievements are highlighted and discussed.
