The importance of state academic standards soared in January 2002 with passage of the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). Not only does that milestone law require all states to have demanding academic standards in place and to demonstrate steady student progress toward academic proficiency as set forth in those standards, it also links states' accountability for increasing students' achievement to the quality of their teachers. The Higher Education Act also asks states to report annually on pass rates on licensure tests taken by prospective teachers and on how their K-12 standards relate to their teacher-preparation program standards. For the first time in U.S. history, these key elements of our public-education system are joined--and they are all joined to state academic standards that set forth what K-12 students are expected to learn in core subjects. The quality of those standards thus matters more than ever before.
