Dix ans après les premières élections au suffrage universel en Afrique du Sud (1994) survenant après une période d'apartheid de près d'un demi-siècle, quel bilan pour l'école dans ce pays aujourd'hui ? Dans quelle mesure peut-on parler de rupture avec le passé ? Sous l'apartheid, Blancs, Métis, Asiatiques et Noirs font l'objet de processus de scolarisation séparés relevant d'un grand nombre de ministères en principe indépendants mais en réalité très étroitement tributaires de la politique de discrimination instaurée par le Parti National après les élections de 1948.
