Xadrez Os 2022 Melhores Jogadores Da História - Hindenburg Melão Jr. 2022-01-11

Desde que Arpad Elo apresentou seu método pioneiro para calcular os ratings dos jogadores de Xadrez, nos anos 1960, tornou-se possível comparar as forças dos mesmos de diferentes épocas. Mas havia ainda alguns problemas. Um deles é a inflação no rating. O outro é que esse método dependia de que houvesse uma densa rede de partidas que conectasse os jogadores em confrontos mútuos. Sem isso, suas forças não podiam ser comparadas nem medidas. Por essa razão o sistema Elo só pode ser aplicado adequadamente a partir do ano 1843. Graças aos esforços de Rob Edwards, que

“garimpou” livros antigos e ampliou os grandes bancos de dados disponíveis em formato digital, foi possível estender esse limite até 1809. Mas ainda havia mais de 300 anos de história, sem que os jogadores desse período pudessem ter suas forças comparadas com os de outras épocas. Agora tornou-se possível preencher essa lacuna, calculando os ratings de jogadores desde o ano 1475, resultando na compilação mais completa de ratings de jogadores de Xadrez. Além disso, os ratings são apresentados em 3 listas diferentes: o rating absoluto, com base na força efetiva que demonstravam pela qualidade dos lances. O rating deflacionado, que é baseado nos confrontos com outros jogadores e com correção da inflação. E o rating esportivo, similar ao rating FIDE, que combina as distorções associadas à inflação com a evolução na compreensão do jogo. Além de apresentar dois novos métodos para cálculo de rating, um dos quais traz inovações relevantes à Teoria

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da Medida e à Teoria de Resposta ao Item, esse livro trata de vários temas relacionados à Ciência de Dados e à História do Xadrez, por meio das análises de alguns dos eventos mais importantes dessa modalidade, sob uma perspectiva matemática e científica. Um dos novos métodos para cálculo de rating torna possível, pela primeira vez, determinar as forças de jogadores muito antigos, anteriores ao ano 1800, chegando aos primórdios desse esporte, no ano 1475, permitindo responder à velha pergunta: “quem foi o melhor jogador de todos os tempos?”, com o importante diferencial que nossa resposta não deixa de fora alguns dos nomes mais consagrados, como Philidor, Greco, Ruy Lopez, Leonardo da Cutri, Damiano, Lucena e tantos outros grandes jogadores do passado. Também são analisados alguns casos extraordinários, como o de Louis Eichborn. Esse jogador tem intrigado historiadores há décadas, porque embora seja pouco conhecido, ele venceu

mais de 90% de suas partidas contra Anderssen. Seria ele o melhor jogador da história? Ou teria jogado milhares de partidas contra Anderssen, mas priorizou os registros de suas poucas vitórias? A dúvida sobre a verdadeira força de Eichborn chegou ao fim e o resultado é muito diferente do que se pensava. Quando Kasparov foi vencido por Deep Blue, em 1997, num dos matches mais polêmicos, foi correto interpretar que a partir de então as máquinas haviam superado os humanos no Xadrez? Qual foi a qualidade de jogo (convertida em rating) de Deep Blue naquele evento? E a qualidade de jogo de Kasparov? Havia fundamentos nas acusações feitas contra a IBM? Entre Greco e Philidor, assim como entre Philidor e Staunton, há duas grandes lacunas, nas quais não se sabia ao certo quem foram os melhores nesses períodos. Em caráter inédito, essas lacunas puderam ser preenchidas, apontando quais foram os melhores do mundo desde 1465 até 2021. Estas e muitas

outras perguntas são analisadas com profundidade e rigor, com o auxílio de uma nova ferramenta estatística, por meio da qual podemos calcular os ratings dos jogadores com base em apenas 1 partida, ou até mesmo com base no fragmento de uma partida. Se você se interessa por esses assuntos, venha participar dessa deliciosa aventura enxadrística e matemática, cheia de surpresas e emoções!

PREFACE TO THE SIXTH EDITION In the Sixth Edition of this book there is a notable change, which we are sure that all our supporters will appreciate. While we were considering the advisability of bringing it out in the current year we were approached by Mr. Reuben Fine with a suggestion that he should under take the task of revision and we gladly agreed. Reuben Fine needs no introduction to those who are interested in the game of chess. His past achievements had already made him famous and he added another glorious chapter to the story of his career, just as he had finished his work for us, by tying for the first place in the great A. V. R. O. Tournament

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towards the end of 1938. Naturally we gave our reviser a free hand in dealing with his task, merely reserving to ourselves the editorial right of making such slight changes in his text as might seem to us necessary. Mr. Fine, however, scrupulously adhered to the traditions of Modern Chess Openings, while availing himself fully of the privilege which must be conceded to a master of his rank of expressing his personal opinions on the lines of play which are illustrated in the book, and altering as he thought fit the introductions to the various openings. In comparing this new edition with its predecessor we may note that it contains 332 pages and 1,215 columns, as against 300 pages and 1,060 columns of seven years ago, We have gladly got rid of the cumbrous device of Addenda, which was forced upon us by circumstances of production in 1932. We have also, in deference to Mr. Fines wishes, abandoned the use of starred columns to indicate what

appears to be the best line of play for both sides. In his preface the reviser explains the system adopted by him in appraising lines of play, so no comment on it is needed from us. The only difficulty which arose in the completion of this edition was caused by our desire to introduce new variations from the A. V. R. O. Tournament after the manuscript had been sent to the printers and was in process of being set up. The printers work was held back sufficiently to permit the mention of the most important of these and it so happened that this delay made it possible to put in some of the novelties from the Hastings Tournament of 1938-39 and a few from the Leningrad-Moscow Tournament this year. In conclusion we should like to convey our personal thanks to Mr. Fine for the admirable way in which he has carried out his revision on which point we think our readers will agree, and to acknowledge how little he left us to do. The manuscript was typed by his

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wife, and the printers had no difficulty on the score of illegibility. We desire also to express our gratitude to all who have helped us in the preparation of this new edition, and especially to our assistants in the exacting work of reading the proofs, with particular mention of Messrs. F. J. Camm and R. Hutter, and Sir Gilbert Jackson. THE EDITORS.
