Daisetsu Teitarō Suzuki was a key figure in the introduction of Buddhism to the non-Asian world. Zen Buddhism - Daisetz T. Suzuki 1996-07-01

No other figure in history has played a bigger part in opening the West to Buddhism than the eminent Zen author, D.T. He tells how to study this scripture, compares it with the popular Zen Buddhism discusses such typical and important doctrines as Mind-only the Triple body of the Buddha and many minor topics.
